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OVERVIEW OF THE ENTRANCE EXAMINATION

This entrance examination instruction is for the Master of Engineering and Master of Social and Healthcare, Technological Transformation Leadership, online studies degree.

The entrance examination consists of two components:

PART A: a written research plan of your master thesis and a video presenting your personal motivation for taking part in the master's degree program. The written research plan is a proposed development area for an organization and supports your future development as a leader or manager for the specific organization.

PART B: Your personal video statement is to help clarify to us why you would like to take part in the master's degree.

The following document supplies instructions for the completion and submission of the research plan and the video of your personal statement.

Both the research plan and your personal video must be submitted by 16th of March for consideration and late applications will not be considered. The maximum points used in evaluation of the application are as follows: research proposal is worth 60 points, the lowest accepted score being 30 points, and personal video statement is worth 40 points, the lowest accepted score being 20 points. Both components of the entrance application must be completed and submitted for evaluation and receive at least a combined minimum score of 50 points.

Part A. Written research plan

The applicant completes a thesis research plan explaining their intentions to complete their thesis.

The Master's degree includes a thesis, which is usually a development project undertaken for an organization. The thesis stands for 30 credits of the degree and represents approximately 800 hours of work. The thesis aims at developing a specific aspect or process for an organization, resulting in improved or enhanced working procedures. The subjects of improvement can relate to processes, work descriptions or working procedures within an organisation. The thesis can also cover the development of new concepts, products or services or other ways in which to develop the overall working life.

Part B. The motivational video

The motivational video explains the applicant's motivation to undertake the degree, professional career plans and the capability to complete the degree.



COMPLETING THE ENTRANCE EXAM

PART A: A research plan as to how to carry out the thesis covering a development of a working life-oriented research development project (60 points)

Choose for example a topic from your workplace that you think needs development or implementation. You can also choose as the development plan topic relating to the start-up or development of your own business or alternatively, another current topic that develops working life.

Draw up a development plan for the topic you selected (3-4 pages, including reference list/A4) as follows:

Working name for the development project

- 1. Background of the project
- Explain why the development of that issue is current and necessary. Also, describe why you are interested in developing the topic you have chosen
- 2. Describe the concrete purpose and aim and outcome of the development project.
 - What is the development, improvement or change taking place due to the project and what concrete outcomes are there in the project.
 - Consider relevant research approach.
- 3. How will you undertake the development project
 - Read the research method literature, select the research/development methods that you would use in your project. Describe the stages of the project and the methods used in the various phases. Justify the choice of methods using research method literature.
- 4. Create an initial schedule for your project.
- Consider what literature you need to have in the knowledge base of your work. Use literature to define the key concepts of your work and include a list of references at the end of your work.
- 6. Write up the development plan using the Times New Roman, size 11, font and line spacing 1.5. The width and height of the margins are 2-2.5 cm.
- At the top left of the document, type your full name, address, phone number, and email address.

We do not provide additional instructions regarding the written assignment!!



Part B. The motivational video (40 points)

The video of your personal statement explains the applicant's motivation to undertake the degree, professional career plans, and the capability to complete the degree.

The video interview will be carried out using the RecRight interview tool. You will receive a link to RecRight by e-mail no later than the 28 January 2025. To carry out motivational video, you only need a web camera or some other smart mobile device and a working Internet connection. You can answer the given questions over several recording sessions, and the videos will only be sent on to us for viewing when you press the Send button. Send your answer by 16 March 2025 11:59 pm. at the latest.

There will be two questions. You need to record a video of no more than 1 minute and 30 seconds for each question:

- 1. Tell us briefly about yourself: your name, your educational background and work experience. Tell us what motivated you to apply for this degree, what competences you particularly expect to gain as a result of these studies, and how the education received will benefit your professional development and/or career plans?
- 2. The workload required by students for the studies consists of a total of about 1600 hours in short programmes (60 credits, 1-1½ years) and 2400 hours (90 credits, 2-2½ years). This corresponds to an average of 20 h/week. Tell us how you intend to find that time for your studies? Also tell us about your English language skills (conversation skills, spoken comprehension, reading comprehension, and text production).

Please make sure that your face can be seen well in the video.

SUBMITTING WRITTEN TASK AND VIDEO RECORDING

Upload the written task to your application at studyinfo.fi during 8 January – 16 March 2025 at 11.59 p.m. It takes some time to upload the attachments, so don't leave it in the last minute!

Please note that although the deadline of submitting the tasks is 16 March, 2025, you must remember to fill in the application during the application period of 8 - 22 January 2025 at 3.00 p.m. (UTC +2).



The format and naming of the written task

Submit your written task as a pdf document. Name the document as follows: Lastname_firstname_TLTIYTTL25SV or HLTIYTTL25SV (for example Johnson_John_TLTIYTTL25SV).

Carrying out the video interview

- A link for the video recording to be in the RecRight service will be sent to applicants by email after the joint application period. You will receive a link to RecRight by e-mail no later than the 28 January 2025. Send your video answer by 16 March 2025 11:59 pm. at the latest.
- The use of RecRight is described on the last page of these instructions.
- The interview video must also be submitted by 16 March 2025 at 11:59 pm the latest.

Please, make sure to record your personal video well in advance of the deadline. If your submission fails for some reason, you will then have time resubmit the video.

ASSESSMENT OF THE EXAMS

The maximum score is 100 points. In order to be selected, the applicant must complete both sections successfully and receive a total of at least 50 points. The maximum score for the written assignment is 60 points, the lowest accepted score being 30 points. The maximum number of points in the interview is 40 points, the lowest accepted score being 20 points

Assessment of the written assignment

The evaluation will focus on the following:

- Justification, topicality and relevance of the topic
- The logic and clarity of the research plan and the reflection of the research methods chosen with regards to the literature used.
- Correctness of the written text, case language, clarity, and referencing of used materials.

Assessment of the motivational video



The evaluation of the video centers around the importance of this education in the student's professional development and career plans, ability to organize study time, and English language competence.

A link to the RecRight service will be sent to applicants by email after the joint application period.
